

Singer/songwriter Jocelyn Scofield to perform

Singer/songwriter Jocelyn Scofield has been compared to music legends Joni Mitchell and Carol King, as well as contemporary artists Sara Bareilles and Fiona Apple.

Scofield, who hails from Michigan has performed in 20 states and traveled over 30,000 miles during the past three years performing both original and cover tunes. She has played at festivals, coffee houses, conferences, concert series and air fairs, among other venues.

She has independently released two albums. Her 2005 CD, "This Life," received rave reviews from many publications. *Indie-Music Magazine* called her a "true composer ... with a voice like a gutsier Fiona Apple." *CollectedSounds.com* wrote: "It's an excellent showcase for her strong vocals and piano playing. Vocally she has the same force as Jewel once had, and some of Fiona Apple's jazz inflections."

Scofield, who has co-written songs with Grammy Award winners and hit country songwriters, plans to release a collection of 10 original songs this June.

"I'm producing, recording, writing and arranging every song by myself," she said. "Producing is a new thing for me. The album will have the pop, folk and jazz influences, but will combine other styles I love, including classical and electronic."

Scofield plans to release the album digitally and is exploring alternative, earth-friendly packaging for the album. CD trays will likely be made out of potato starch and recycled paper.
